| a. Non-consensual sexual contact of any type with a resident | Verbal Abuse |
| b. Hitting, slapping, punching, biting, kicking | Mental Abuse |
| c. Any drug used for discipline or convenience of staff to care for a resident and isn't required to treat a medical symptom | Neglect |
| d. The use of verbal or nonverbal conduct which causes or has the potential to cause the resident to experience humiliation, intimidation, fear, shame, agitation, or degradation. | Physical Restraint |
| e. Use of oral, written, or gestured communication or sounds to residents within hearing distance. | Corporal Punishment |
| f. Any manual method, physical, or mechanical device, equipment or material that is attached or adjacent to a resident's body, cannot be removed easily by the resident and restricts their freedom of movement or normal access to their body | Physical Abuse |
| g. Taking advantage of a resident for personal gain through the use of manipulation, intimidation, threats, or coercion. | Chemical Restraint |
| h. The deliberate misplacement, exploitation, or wrongful, temporary, or permanent use of a resident's belongings or money without the resident's consent. | Involuntary Seclusion |
| i. Separation of a resident from other residents or from his/her room or confinement to their room against their will, or the will of their representative. | Exploitation |
| j. Punishment used as a means to correct or control behavior | Misappropriation of Property |

k. Failure to provide goods and services to the resident that are necessary to avoid physical harm, pain, mental anguish, or emotional distress Sexual Abuse
